Carol Gimbel

Viola

Known for her bewitching, "goose-bump-worthy" performances where "the stagecraft alone is worth the price of admission", violist Carol Gimbel has enjoyed a recent debut recital at Lincoln Center's Rose Studio and appearances at Piccolo Spoleto Festival, the Music Matters Series at La Grua Center, Haus der Musik (Mexico) and the Ottawa ChamberFest (Canada).

A multifaceted musician, producer, and entrepreneur, Ms. Gimbel has spearheaded the commissioning and presentation of major concert and multimedia works, premiering numerous acoustic and electro-acoustic works for the viola, and championing chamber works for small and large ensembles. Her upcoming release on Navona Records, "Chamber Works for Viola" features the music of Order of Canada and 40-year CBC veteran composer and producer David Jaeger.

In 2008 she founded her organization 'Music in the Barns' in Toronto, Ontario, to actively explore what it means to be a classical musician today experimenting with performance and education traditions and reimagining them for 21st century ears. Music in the Barns has pioneered innovative approaches to contemporary classical music events almost everywhere except conventional concert halls. From the Hearn Generating Station's 400,000 sq. ft to intimate storefronts and festival appearances, Music in the Barns has been hailed for "obliterating the audience / performer boundary". Currently, in partnership with the Canada Council for the Arts Digital Strategies Fund, Music in the Barns is exploring strategies for making music pedagogy more accessible with the development and early testing of a prototype digital musical instrument.

Ms. Gimbel regularly presents masterclasses and lectures regarding alternative viola careers, with appearances at the University of Toronto, International Viola Congress in Los Angeles, and the International Maker Faire in New York among others.

Pennsylvania-born, Ms. Gimbel's early musical influence was shaped by the string playing legacy of the Philadelphia Orchestra, and grew through an immersion in chamber music under the tutelage of Paul Katz and members of the Cleveland Quartet. With gratitude to the time spent with her beloved teachers and mentors, Ms. Gimbel performs with her compatriot the ex-Emanuel Vardi viola crafted circa 1725.

About Guest Artist Marina Poplavskaya

Russian born mezzo-soprano, Marina Poplavskaya has established herself internationally as one of the most arresting young artists to be heard today. Metropolitan Opera star, Ms. Poplavskaya has performed at important theatres throughout the world such as the Vienna State Opera, Bavarian State Opera, Munich, Berlin State Opera, Netherlands Opera, Los Angeles Opera, and many others including the Salzburg Festival.

Additional Outreach

At the heart of Carol's music-making is a focus on storytelling and community building to help audiences connect to the world and to themselves in new ways.

Carol's mission was sparked at age 13, with her wondering why there were so many string players in her area of suburban Pennsylvania, and yet no youth orchestra. This led Carol and her father to found the Youth Orchestra of Bucks County—and set Carol off on her life's quest to create more opportunities for audiences and musicians to find connections.

Carol went on to build her award-winning Music in the Barns project and has been commissioned to design and curate programs for the Toronto Summer Music Festival, the Canadian Music Centre, Symphony in the Barn, the Drake Hotel and The Foundry Historic Building Redevelopment Project.

She enjoys talking and participating in panel discussions about her experiences including University of Toronto, Los Angeles Viola Congress and the International Maker Faire in New York City.

"Young musician, avid amateur, seasoned pro, and enthusiastic concert attendee – all are welcome at #1000Strings," says Carol. "The outdoor performance will feature award-winning composer John Oswald's seminal work Spectre (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=BH1RLz5q-vk), which was commissioned by the Kronos Quartet in 1990 and combines live quartet with multi-layered overdub, creating the illusion of a 1000-piece string orchestra. With #1000Strings, the community joins forces to make that illusion a reality."
